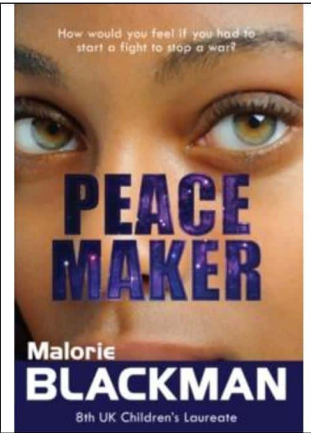


Michela knows the law - everyone must wear a Peace Maker device at all times, and it must never be tampered with.

Reminiscent of Slumdog Millionaire, this contemporary adventure story set on the streets of London follows a boy whose luck is about to change.

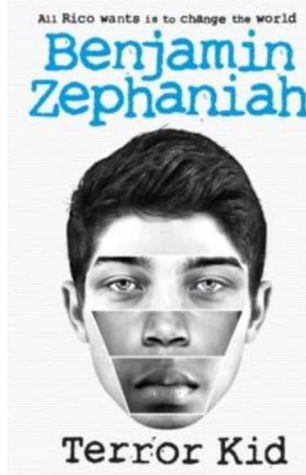
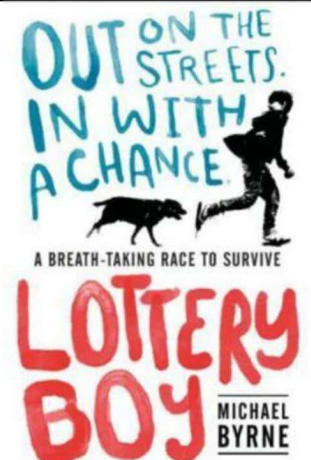
Since his mother's death, Bully has lost his old life.
