We believe that every child should have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument and, as such, pupils at Ripley may opt to receive **individual instrumental or vocal tuition** from our team of **specialist musicians**. Lessons currently cost £110 per discipline, per term, for ten twenty-five minute lessons.

Why should my child take music lessons?

Aside from the fact that research has shown that playing a musical instrument **stimulates your brain and can increase your memory**, learning an instrument can also help to develop the following transferrable skills:

- **Organisation** and **self-discipline**
- **Team work**
- **Perseverance** and **concentration**
- **Hand-eye coordination**
- **Breath control** and **stamina**
- **Literacy** and **numeracy**
- **Cultural literacy**
- **Confidence**

Above all, learning a musical instrument is **highly enjoyable** and something from which your child will benefit for the rest of their life.

Will we need to buy an instrument?

We would always advise pupils to get their own instrument, but understand that this can be a difficult decision when starting out. As such, we have a stock of instruments in school which can be borrowed (contact us for details) or we can advise you on rental or hire-purchase schemes which are available locally.

Absence & refund policy

Timetable

In September, January and April, pupils will be given a timetable showing their lesson times for the forthcoming term. We endeavour to give each pupil a rotating time slot to ensure that there is minimum regular disruption to other subjects. We guarantee to give an average of **ten lessons each term** to all pupils, adding up to **30 lessons over the course of the year**.

Absence

If a pupil is going to be **absent** as a result of a school activity, excursion or examination, he/she should notify the instrumental tutor **at least a week in advance**. The tutor will mark the register with an R (refund) and if the lesson can not be made up at another time then these sessions will be refunded.

If a pupil is away from school **on the day of a lesson**, parents should ring school on 01524 64496, and leave a message to **notify the instrumental tutor** of the absence. This absence will be recorded with an E (excused). In these situations we will strive to make up the 30 contracted lessons, but we will not be able to refund any shortfall.

If a pupil misses a lesson **without prior notification**, an X (no explanation) will be marked in the register. These **lessons will not be refunded** and it may not be possible for pupils to receive the full contracted number of tuition sessions.

If the instrumental tutor sees a **pattern of absences** developing then school will endeavour to contact parents so that the matter can be properly addressed. Genuine problems will be dealt with as generously as possible, but **absences due to forgetfulness or lack of organisation will not be considered**.

Practice

Pupils will be issued with a Practice Diary in which progress will be monitored and targets for the forthcoming week will be set. There is space for feedback each week if you wish to communicate with the instrumental tutor about any matters arising. With regard to practice, it is difficult to generalise on the subject, but if a minimum of **20 minutes per day** is not being maintained then adequate progress is unlikely to be made.

Stopping lessons

If your child does experience difficulty progressing on his/her instrument and you wish to terminate the tuition, we ask that you give us **at least a half term's notice in writing**.

Ensembles

Pupils are eligible to receive free instrumental tuition in school via lunchtime and after-school ensemble practices; **it is expected that pupils who have lessons in school will take part in at least one ensemble**. The ensembles will be rehearsing for public performances and a good standard of performance will be expected. Pupils who take part in ensembles make much faster progress with their skills in sight-reading and aural awareness.

Tuition options

Lessons are available in the following following disciplines† at Ripley during the school day:

Strings: Violin, Viola, 'Cello, Double Bass

Guitar: Classical Guitar, Electric Guitar, Bass Guitar

Woodwind: Flute, Oboe, Clarinet, Bassoon, Saxophone

Keyboard: Piano, Organ

Brass: Trumpet/Cornet, French/Tenor Horn, Trombone, Baritone/Euphonium, Tuba
