Aims of the subject: To develop acting skills, to perform a range of characters in a range of styles/genre. To understand the social, historical and political context and subtext of a range of set texts. To understand the rehearsal process and how a piece of theatre develops over time. To be able to recognise a range of styles in performance and review the choices made by the actors/directors. To be able to self and peer assess with confidence using the full range of the drama vocabulary.
