



Key Stage: 5

Subject: Spanish

Aims of the subject:

In the course of their A level studies, students will develop their linguistic skills alongside their understanding of the culture and society of countries where Spanish is spoken. They study social and technological change alongside highlights of Spanish-speaking artistic culture, including Hispanic music and cinema. They also explore the influence of the past on present-day Spanish-speaking communities. Throughout their studies, they will learn the language in the context of Spanish-speaking countries and the issues and influences which have shaped them. Students will study a film which has had a significant impact on contemporary Spanish culture.
