## If someone in your household has COVID-19 symptoms

Please can I remind parents that if someone in your household has symptoms of COVID-19, you should not send your son or daughter into school, even if they are well themselves. All members of the household should self-isolate for 14 days. The person with symptoms should get a test. If the result comes back negative, your child can return to school immediately. If it is positive, all members of the household should continue their self-isolation.

#### **Protocols**

As you will be aware from our risk assessment, we have a protocol in place with clear actions to follow in the event of a confirmed case of COVID-19 in school. Please be reassured that we will inform parents if there is a confirmed case and we will communicate the actions we have been advised to take by the DFE and Public Health England. We have not had any confirmed cases in school this week. Thank you to all the staff in school, particularly our cleaners, who are all working hard to keep us all as safe as possible.
