Equipment

The school stationery shop is open at break time every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Pupils pay for their items using their Scopay account, in the same way they purchase their lunch.

Parking

We have received an email from a resident on Beeching Close near school. Parents are regularly parking here at drop off time and blocking driveways. This is preventing residents from leaving to pick up their own children from other schools. Please be mindful of our neighbours when parking.
