Face coverings

It is very encouraging to see infection rates in the area so low, however we continue to be vigilant in school. The DFE have recommended the use of face coverings in classrooms continue until the next review point in May. It has been encouraging how well students have adapted to this. Please do remind your child about the need to bring a face mask to school each day and to continue to wash these regularly.

Coats in lessons

We continue to have the windows open to ensure adequate ventilation, however now that it is warmer, pupils are expected to remove coats in classrooms. The teacher may decide to let pupils wear them if it is chilly, however this is down to their discretion.

Twice weekly tests

Please remind your son / daughter to continue to do their lateral flow tests twice weekly. We recommend Sunday night and Wednesday night. Do inform us of a positive test via positivetest@ripley.lancs.sch.uk

Symptoms

Please continue to be vigilant regarding symptoms of COVID. If your child is unwell and you suspect COVID (high temperature, persistent cough, loss of taste or smell) please do keep them off, let us know on the above email address and book a COVID test.

Hair cuts

Please can I also take this opportunity to politely remind you of our uniform and appearance policy. In particular, now that barbers and hairdressers are fully reopen, haircuts should not be of an extreme nature or colour. Haircuts should not be shorter than a 'grade two' in length. Understanding has been shown during the lockdown periods and we thank you in anticipation of your support with this going forward.
