# **COVID** update

### **Positive cases**

I can confirm that we have had notification of a further three positive tests in the last two days: one in Y9, one in Y10 and one in Y12. The Y9 and 10 cases have been confirmed by a PCR test and we await the results of the test for the Year 12 student. We hope all who are affected remain well and don't suffer with symptoms too much. We have made contact with the close contacts who need to self-isolate already, so there is no further action needed if you have not heard from us.

We continue to follow our measures set out in the risk assessment including our enhanced cleaning processes.

#### **Lateral Flow Tests and Symptoms**

Please continue to take your lateral flow tests at home twice a week and keep your child off if they are experiencing any symptoms. Recently some of the confirmed cases have had sore throats, a headache and been extremely tired. Please watch out for these symptoms and keep your child off until they have had a PCR test as a precaution.

#### **Figures**

Despite the rising cases in Lancaster and the surrounding area, I would like to reassure parents that the number of pupils who have tested positive for COVID-19 at Ripley remains very low, especially in comparison to other schools in the county. Since May half term, we have had the following confirmed cases: 5 in Year 8, 2 in Year 9, 2 in Year 10 and 2 in Year 12.

We are aware that the impact of a small number of cases is felt by many due to the need for us to track and trace and ask other children who may have been in contact on the bus or in school to selfisolate. There is currently lots of media coverage regarding track and trace and isolations in schools. We are equally frustrated about the impact this has on schools and on our young people, especially those who have had to isolate more than once. However we will continue to follow government guidance as we have done throughout the pandemic.

We thank you for your understanding and support in these final weeks of term.

# PSHE day – Tuesday 6 July

On Tuesday 6th July we will be suspending the timetable to have another PSHE day. The topics being covered are outlined below:

**Year 7** will be focusing on safety, looking at how we keep ourselves safe in the physical world and online.
