# **COVID and Lateral Flow Testing**

Whilst COVID numbers in Lancaster are apparently quite high, I am pleased to report that numbers of COVID cases are very low across the school. Please continue to test twice a week (Sunday and Wednesday) and let us know of any positive results via <u>positivetest@ripley.lancs.sch.uk</u>. Results should be recorded with the NHS online.

Thank you for keeping your child at home if they are experiencing any of the COVID symptoms. Please also book a PCR test as a precaution if they are unwell.

## Winter vomiting bugs

Please be aware that it's that time of year again! If your child is unwell with sickness or diarrhoea, they must remain home until at least 48 hours from the latest episode. Please do not send them in earlier as they may spread this infection in school.

## **Overdue library books**

This week we have started an amnesty on overdue library books. There are currently nearly 1500 overdue books across the school, some of which go back years. The total stock missing has a replacement value in excess of £12,000 and we would very much like to get these books back so that they can be used by other pupils. Please do encourage your child to have a look in their bedroom for overdue books and get them to bring them in on Monday. It doesn't matter how long they have had the books - we will be delighted to get them back.

#### Attendance

Mr Wilson has been talking to pupils in assemblies about the importance of good attendance and the direct link between attendance and making great progress. To ensure our pupils are successful, we set an attendance target of at least 97% - this equates to five school days of absence in one academic year. We are mindful that this is obviously affected at the moment by COVID and winter bugs (as mentioned above!) when it is essential that pupils do stay off.



We encourage you to make dental and medical appointments outside of school time as far as possible, but if your child is unavoidably unable to be in school then please phone our office number on 01524 64496 (option 1). If we do not receive a reason for an absence as soon as possible on the morning, this has to be marked as unauthorised and the school will get in touch with you on the same school day.
