Attendance, Punctuality & Absence procedure



- All students should maintain excellent attendance & punctuality.
- In form rooms by **8.45am**.
- Late Meetings with Attendance Officer.
- **Persistent lateness** will result in detentions or a contract as appropriate.
- If your son/daughter is absent through illness or other unavoidable circumstances, the absence should be reported before 8.45am by a parent or carer by telephoning the school.
- For **long-term absence**, on-going **medical evidence** will be required.
- Where the absence is known about <u>in advance</u>, e.g. hospital and dental appointments, driving tests, a 'Request for Authorised Absence' form should be submitted to the Attendance Officer (Mrs Quagliana, based in the study room) for approval. Available at reception and on Firefly.
- **Requests for special leave of absence** for important events must also be made via the 'Request for Authorised Absence' form and this request will be considered by the Head of Sixth Form.
- Only **urgent** medical appointments should be made in school hours.
- Driving lessons must not be arranged during school time.

Rewards and Behaviour in Sixth Form



- Our expectation is that all Sixth Form students will behave with due regard at all times to their role as senior members of the school
- Our **ASPIRE rewards system** (Attendance, Success, Progress, Initiative/Innovation, Relationships, Endeavour) acknowledges the contributions and achievements of the students to the Sixth Form, the school and to the wider community.
- House Points (reward points) can be given by staff members for a wide variety of positive reasons.
- Where students do not meet expected standards of behaviour, these inappropriate choices will have **consequences**.
- **Sanction Points (Clicks)** will be issued for where there are concerns regarding homework, equipment and behaviour (both in and outside of lessons).
- Full school Behaviour policy available to view on the website.



A Level Success & Independent Learning



- The purpose of sixth form study is to be the stepping stone from school to University or employment. Students need to learn to work independently to be successful in their next steps as well as at A level.
- Less teacher contact than at GCSE.
- Study periods.
- Directed independent learning reactive.
- Undirected independent learning proactive.
