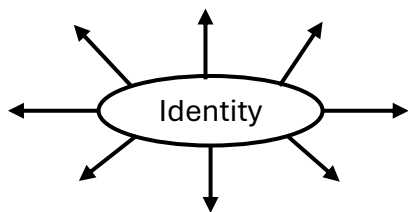


Photography Bridging Project 2025

You can complete this task entirely digitally (we will be using Microsoft power point during the course), or physically if you wish (documented on paper or in a small sketchbook). Task 1) Create a mind map focusing on the theme of 'Identity'. Some ideas – objects, people, places...



Task 2) Research - Find 2 photographers who explore the theme of 'Identity'. There are loads! Some suggestions can be found to the right of this sheet if you are stuck. Use this websites to help

Present your research digitally or physically. Include the name of the photographer, at least 4 images of their work and a written response, answering the following –
What the work is about
Why it interests you
How it connects to the theme identity

Task 3) Planning your photoshoot – What do you intend to take photographs of? Using your artists as inspiration, plan your photoshoot. What will you take photographs of? Where will you take them? Write a short explanation saying why you have chosen this idea. If you are stuck, use the suggestions on the right.

Task 4) Taking your photographs. Take 20-30 original photograph that use your plan and explore your theme. Use your phone or camera. If you can, try to experiment with different angles and lighting.

Task 5) Presentation - Select your best 6 images. Edit them using basic editing tools if you can. Present them on a page and write a short paragraph, explaining why they are successful.
