UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE POLICY

Introduction and Principles

School uniform plays an important role in establishing the ethos of a school and is strongly encouraged by the DfE. At Ripley we believe that our uniform policy benefits the school in a number of ways:

- It encourages pupils to identify with the school and nurtures the notion of community
- It protects children from social pressures to dress in a particular way
- It supports discipline and good behaviour
- It instils a sense of pride in the school
- It promotes more effective teaching and learning
- It is not a prohibitive factor for any family applying for admission to Ripley

The appearance of pupils is also an important factor at Ripley in promoting good behaviour and ensuring the health and safety of pupils and staff.

The Government, although it has published guidance, has made it clear that it is for the school's Governing Body to decide whether there should be a uniform and other rules relating to appearance, and if so, what they should be. Therefore, this document seeks to clarify the Governors' expectations at Ripley with regard to uniform and appearance.

An actual list of the acceptable, not acceptable and supplementary items pupils are permitted to wear is within this document. This includes particular items parents can apply to the Headteacher for permission to wear. A judgement will be made with regard to any request based on whether the item is in sympathy with the Christian ethos of the school or any other judgement including health or safety. The Headteacher in consultation with pastoral colleagues will consider each application and reach a decision as soon as possible but until such time as a decision is made the item should not be worn for school.

Parents/Guardians are asked to contact us if they are in any doubt about any item of uniform or issue of presentation for their child so that they can clarify what is acceptable before agreeing to permanent or semi-permanent changes in appearances or sending the child to school wearing those items of which they are unsure.

Full school uniform must be worn at all times throughout the school day, including when travelling to and from school. Pupils are representatives of the school in the wider community, and high standards of appearance help promote a positive image and reflect the values of the school.

Uniform requirements (Years 7 to 11)

As part of our commitment to equality, diversity and inclusion we are always willing to speak to pupils to find a solution which works for both them and the school, in line with our high expectations.

School Uniform

- Royal blue blazer *
- School tie (clip on style) *
- Grey skirt Any grey wide pleated skirt. Please note skirts must be on the knee or touching the knee. The school skirt with the logo * is optional
- Black tailored school trousers. Please note that fashion, tight, flared, cotton drill, jeans-style or styles with patch/combat type pockets are not acceptable.
- White shirt / blouse (to be worn with tie)
- Black tank top (optional) *
- Black opaque tights, black knee high or black ankle socks (with skirt) or black socks (with trousers). No bows or frills
- Black shoes
- Black or blue hair bands / bobbles

P.E. and Games Equipment

- Red mid-layer (Yrs 10-11 may continue to wear the hoody) (optional) *
- Red polo shirt * (Yrs 10-11 may continue to wear navy blue polo shirt)
- Reversible rugby shirt * (boys curriculum only)
- Navy Blue P.E. Skort or Navy Shorts with logo *
- Leggings with logo (optional) *
- Blue tracksuit bottoms with logo * (optional)
- Red hockey or red football socks
- Football boots (or rugby boots for boys curriculum only)
- Trainers (no canvas shoes)
- Swimsuit (1 piece) / swimming trunks
- Swimming hat
- Towel

It is expected that all pupils bring their full PE kit and get changed for PE lessons whether they are taking an active part in the lesson or not.

Detailed Guidance

We give below some notes for guidance and clarification. School uniform lists can sometimes seem over detailed and over particular. Our experience is that we prevent misunderstandings by being very precise about our requirements. We of course do not wish for parents to spend money on items we do not allow to be worn. The full support of parents is expected with regards to their children wearing the correct uniform.

Breaches of Policy

The Uniform and Appearance Policy will be strictly enforced. Pupils must attend the Uniform Room before registration to correct their uniform.

U1 sanctions are issued for breaches of the Uniform and Appearance Policy. In accordance with the Behaviour Policy, repeated offences will result in increased sanctions. Pupils will receive a U1 sanction if they forget items of uniform. However, this will not apply if the missing items have been ordered.

The Headteacher or member of the senior leadership team may ask a pupil to go home briefly to remedy a serious breach of the school's rules on appearance or uniform. This will count as an authorised absence for as long as the absence is strictly necessary. The parent/carer of the child will be contacted in this instance. If it is not possible for pupils to go home to change, they will spend time out of circulation in The Reflection Centre until such time as they conform to the policy.

Schools can refuse to allow a pupil to come into school for failing to wear the uniform or maintain the appearance required by the school. This is not an exclusion. An exclusion is refusing to admit to the school; in the case of a breach of uniform the school is willing to admit the pupil but insist that they are properly dressed.

We are committed to supporting pupils and families with any uniform difficulties and may be able to loan items on a longer-term basis where needed. Alternatively, we may be able to provide financial assistance. Please contact your child's Progress Leader in the first instance.

The academy is always the final arbiter of what constitutes appropriate and acceptable dress and appearance.

Sixth Form Dress Code

The Sixth Form Dress Code reflects the values of the Ripley St Thomas community. A student's adherence to the Dress Code demonstrates respect for the ethos and learning environment. All places of employment have dress code policies.

It is true that dress codes vary significantly between and even within sectors, however, as an employee, we must all comply with whatever rules are set. The dress code policy that follows has been created in consultation with current students and aims to reflect the context of the Ripley community and ethos.

Through appropriate dress, Sixth Form students act as role models for younger students and ambassadors for the school. The school's expectations are that students in years 12 and 13 understand that the Sixth Form is a serious learning environment and that they take a mature and responsible approach towards how they present themselves. This will ensure that their time with us is focused on reaching their goals for life beyond Ripley Sixth Form.

The purpose of this dress code is to maintain a professional appearance and mindset so that we can clearly separate our working week from our personal leisure and relaxation time. An additional benefit is the fact that students will have a good understanding of what to wear for university interviews, job interviews and apprenticeship assessments.





Students are asked to make appropriate choices of clothing from the list below. Clothing choices should be modest, respectful and in keeping with the traditional values and ethos of the Ripley St Thomas community.

 Business style suits comprising either matching or complementary business style jacket tailored trousers dress or skirt (minimum knee length or midi).
